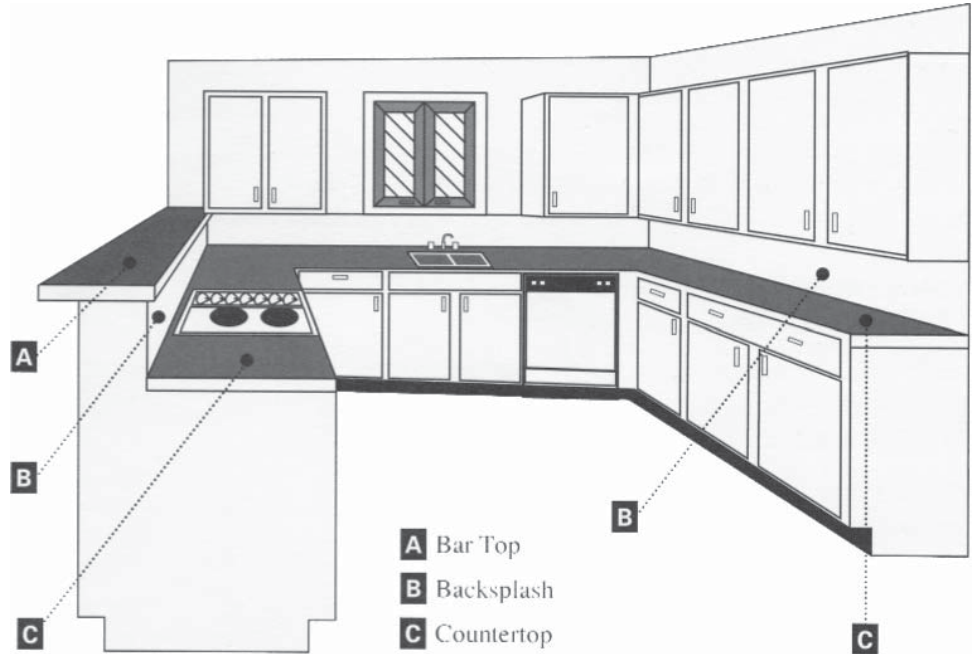


Measure and make a sketch to receive an estimate

You don't have to be a professional designer to plan your new countertop.

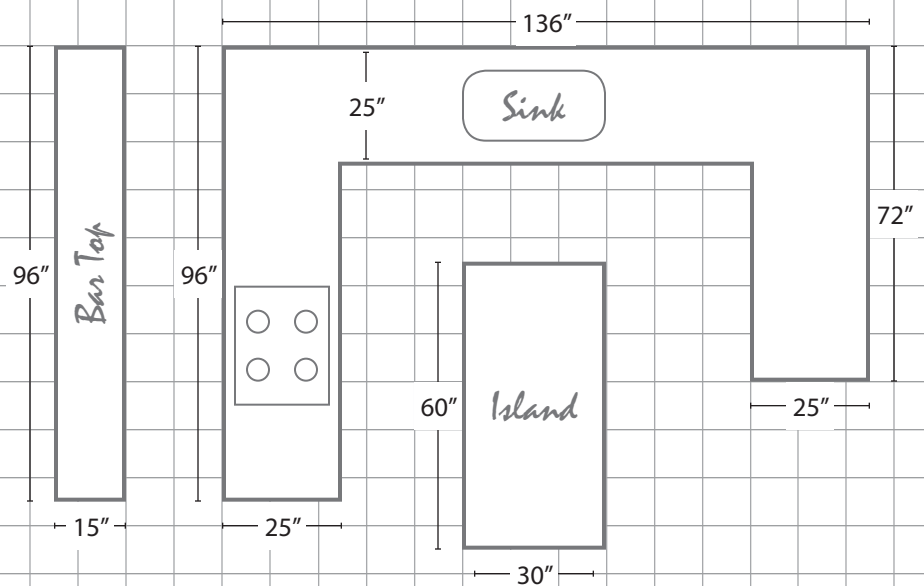
A pencil and measuring tape is all you need to do it yourself.

The sample floorplan below shows you how to draw your kitchen countertop.



1. Draw a sketch of your kitchen countertop.
2. Mark the location of all sinks, cooktops, free-standing stoves and refrigerators.
3. Write down your countertop measurements (in inches) on the floorplan, including depth of countertop.
4. Measure the height of your backsplash.
5. Measure the length and width of any bar tops and islands.
6. Complete your design selections.
7. Contact your Kitchen Designer for an estimate.

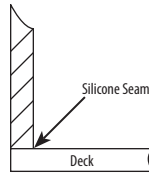

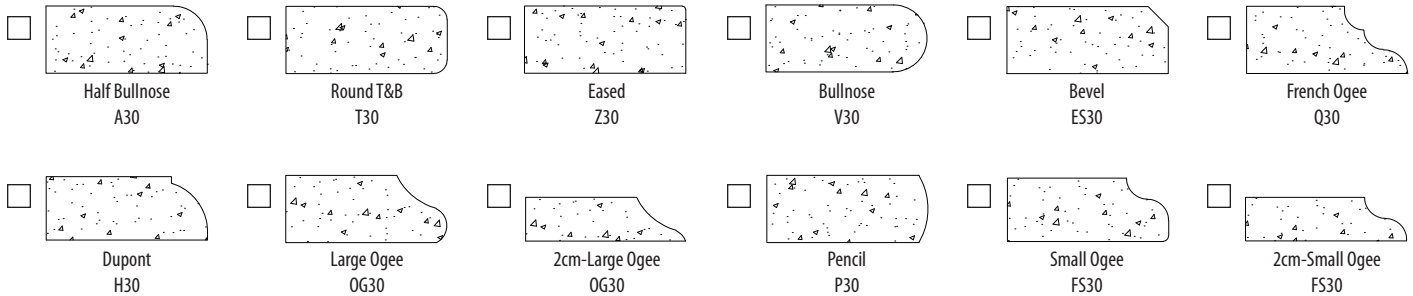


